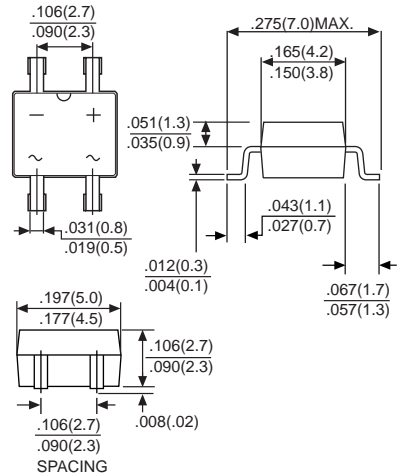

MAXIMUM NON-REPETITIVE SURGE CURRENT

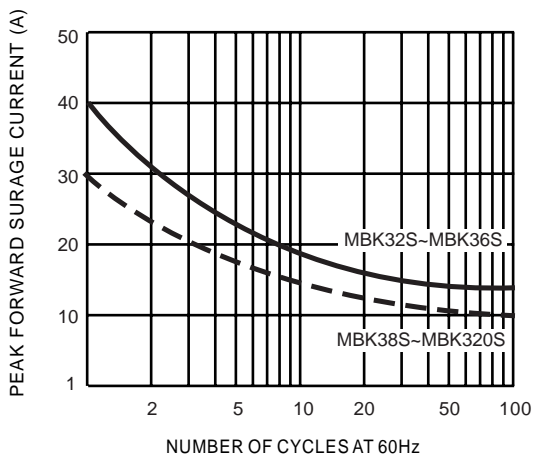

DERATING CURVE FOR OUTPUT RECTIFIED CURRENT

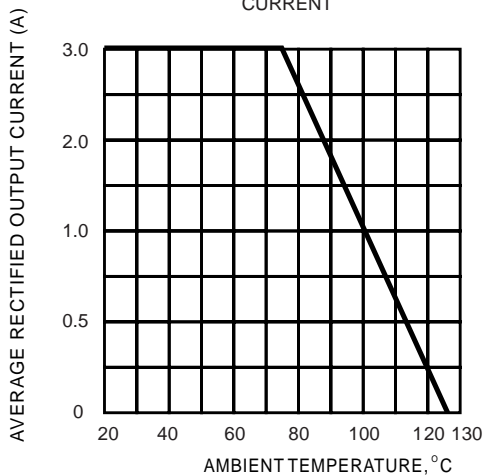

TYPICAL INSTANTANEOUS FORWARD CHARACTERISTICS

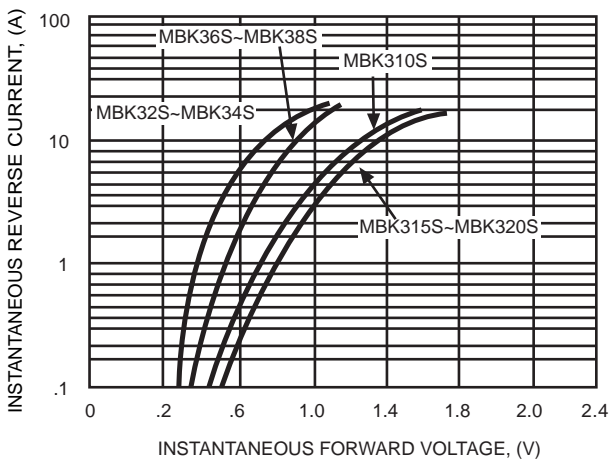
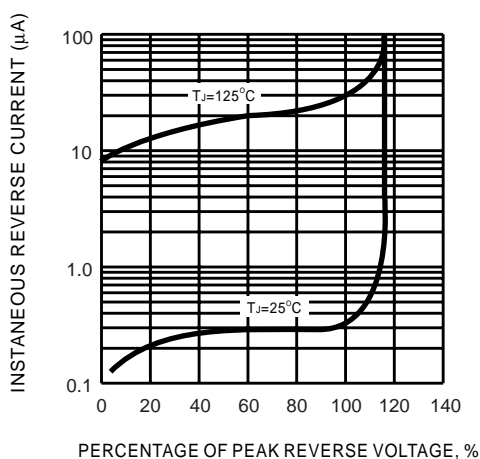
